As for the rich in this present age, charge them not to be haughty, nor to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly provides us with everything to enjoy. 1 TIMOTHY 6:17

In his letter to Timothy, Paul gave a charge to the rich. This includes us all because the temptations of money affect those who have much or little, since before and until now. 1 Be humble.

... Therefore it says, "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble." JAMES 4:6

Every good thing we have is from God and because of Him. Therefore, we are to maintain a posture of humility before Him. Why do you think God opposes the proud?

2 Hope in God.

For to this end we toil and strive, because we have our hope set on the living God, who is the Savior of all people, especially of those who believe. 1 TIMOTHY 4:10
