¹⁶Don't you know that when you offer yourselves to someone as obedient slaves, you are slaves of the one you obey—whether you are slaves to sin, which leads to death, or to obedience, which leads to righteousness? ¹⁷But thanks be to God that, though you used to be slaves to sin, you have come to obey from your heart the pattern of teaching that has now claimed your allegiance. ¹⁸You have been set free from sin and have become slaves to righteousness.

Romans 6:16-18



What does the Bible say?

The Bible speaks of two kinds of slavery: one to sin and the other to righteousness. We are slaves of either one or the other—there is no middle ground. The only difference is, one is an oppressive master and the other is a kind one. Let us look at the following truths as we ponder on which master we are actually serving.

Slavery to sin leads to death.

Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, everyone who sins is a slave to sin."

John 8:34

Everyone who sins is subject to a ruthless and a relentless killer. Disobedience to God's Word ultimately leads to spiritual death. When we continue to sin, we feel our joys uncelebrated, our hopes quenched, and our passions dwindled. A life of slavery to sin is marked by meaninglessness, a lack of purpose, and the absence of fruitful and lasting relationships. Have you experienced this? How were you able to break free from this?

Slavery to righteousness leads to holiness.

You have been set free from sin and have become slaves to righteousness.

Romans 6:18

Righteousness, on the other hand, is having the ability to obey God's Word. This freedom is only achieved in Christ. We need to understand that since God is holy, He cannot tolerate sin in His presence. And so, knowing that we cannot free ourselves from sin, He sent His only Son Jesus to take our

place. Because of that divine exchange on the cross, how does God see us when we receive Jesus' gift of salvation? How are we cleansed from sin (Isaiah 1:18; Psalm 103:12)?

Obedience is from the heart.

But thanks be to God that, though you used to be slaves to sin, you have come to obey from your heart the pattern of teaching that has now claimed your allegiance.

Romans 6:17

Some people obey due to obligation. Others obey out of necessity or under compulsion. But God's way is obedience from the heart (2 John 1:6). It is only when one genuinely accepts Jesus' work on the cross that one can truly obey God's commands by faith (Romans 1:5; 15:26). How is obeying an authority different from obeying someone you love?
