WHAT What does the Bible say?

Love is blind. Sometimes when people are "in love" they tend to only see what they want to see, hence they often ignore all the "bad" about their relationship and only focus on the "good." Is this popular saying biblical? Let us look at some Scriptures and evaluate this expression.

Love does not tolerate wrongdoing.

Love does not delight in evil . . .

1 Corinthians 13:6

There is a big difference between loving someone and tolerating his or her wrongdoing. True love does not delight in evil-it confronts sin. When we truly love someone, we do not turn a blind eye towards his or her sin but confront it with God's Word. Share of a time when you tolerated a wrongdoing of a friend and the consequences that came out of it.

Love takes pleasure in what is true.

. . . but rejoices with the truth.

1 Corinthians 13:6

We often hear the saying, "The truth hurts." This is true to some extent. In relationships, knowing our limitations can be disappointing. However, when we use this to understand, accept, and love each other despite the differences, it can lead to stronger relationships. The point is, true love does not lie, cheat, or deceive. It rejoices with the truth. How has accepting the truth helped you build a stronger relationship with someone?

Love sees a need and acts upon it.

¹⁷If anyone has material possessions and sees his brother in need but has no pity on him, how can the love of God be in him? ¹⁸Dear children, let us not love with words or tongue but with actions and in truth.
