SO WHAT

- What areas in your life do you think you need God's help in? How about those that you think you can handle on your own? Is this good?
- Why do you need to avoid putting your confidence in the flesh (Psalm 71:5)?
- Why does the glory belong only to God? How convinced are you about this?

NOW WHAT

- In what ways can you give back the glory to God? What situations can you think of to do this?
- How will you give value to God's will and purpose over your own worldly aspirations?
- What can you do to know Jesus more and more? Set a time each day to communicate with God in prayer and in reading His Word.

PRAYER

- Ask God to help you place your confidence in Him always.
- Ask the Holy Spirit to lead you in fulfilling God's will so the glory is given to Jesus every time.
- Pray that you will know Jesus Christ more through His Word so you may glorify Him always.

WHAT

There are three biblical essentials to remember to avoid self-centeredness and bring back the glory to Jesus Christ.

³For it is we who are the circumcision, we who worship by the Spirit of God, who glory in Christ Jesus, and who put no confidence in the flesh— ⁴ though I myself have reasons for such confidence. PHILIPPIANS 3:3,4

During Bible times, people thought they could follow the Law on their own than depending on God. Today, people don't only think they can change themselves into what's acceptable before God but they rely on their own strength and ability everyday, leading them to think that they deserve all the credit. People don't know how to trust God, the One Who can do immeasurably beyond our ability. How do you place your confidence in Christ? How do you give God the credit in all that you do?
