WHAT

In 605 B.C., when Jerusalem fell into the hands of Babylonians, some Judean young men from the royal families and nobilities that possess exceptional qualities have been qualified and selected to be trained with the language and literature of Babylon for three years and after that to enter the king’s service. Among these were Daniel, Hannaniah, Mishael and Azariah who have resolved not to sin but to make a stand for God in a pagan environment. What can we learn from them?

1 We need to understand the Word of God.

But Daniel resolved not to defile himself with the royal food and wine . . . DANIEL 1:8

Daniel and his friends resolved not to defile themselves with food and drinks that were offered to idols first before being served. This may seem a brave enough stand as it is but above all, Daniel and his friends understood the laws of God through Moses (Leviticus 11; 17). Why do you think it is important that you understand the Word of God in order to make the right decision and not compromise?

2 You need to make a stand today.

“Please test your servants for ten days: Give us nothing but vegetables to eat and water to drink.” DANIEL 1:12

Daniel did not make a stand before it was too late. When he had the opportunity, he spoke with the guard and bravely arranged with him to give them a different diet for ten days and after that, to test and compare them with the young men who eat the royal food and deal with them according to the outcome. Why it is important to make a stand even before the battle begins?

3 You need to trust in God everyday.
