SO WHAT

- What is the significance of God's fair judgment of us? How do you accept the truth that God is both loving and just?
- What does righteousness have to do with how God judges? How important is it to live a righteous life?
- How would you describe God's mercy? How merciful is God in your life?

NOW WHAT

- Who is one person in your life whom you have treated unjustly or unfairly? Treat that person with the love of Jesus Christ this week.
- Over what area in your life do you need God's righteousness to rule? Ask God for more of His righteousness to be upon you.
- Is there a family member, relative, or friend whom you need to forgive? Ask for God's mercy as you reconcile with that person.

PRAYER

- Ask the Holy Spirit for a greater revelation of God as being both loving and just.
- Pray for God's justice and righteousness to reign in our judicial system and courts.
- Intercede for your family members, friends, and loved ones who still do not have a relationship with Jesus to receive His mercy and forgiveness.
