## WORD

*Whoever works his land will have plenty of bread, but he who follows worthless pursuits lacks sense.*

**PROVERBS 12:11**

Those who are skillful in their work will be recognized for it—even by kings and those in authority. This means that everything we do should be done with utmost care and excellence. If we are faithful with little and make it grow, what does Jesus promise (Matthew 25:21)?

## 2 Integrity

*Whoever walks in integrity walks securely, but he who makes his ways crooked will be found out.* **PROVERBS 10:9**

## 3 Diligence
