APPLICATION

WORD

Let no one despise you for your youth, but set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity. **1 TIMOTHY 4:12**

The church grows not just because one generation knows and follows God, but because one generation passes on the gospel to the next. We see this demonstrated in the lives of Paul and Timothy. In this lesson, we will look at how the youth should be valued—from God’s perspective, from the preceding generation’s perspective, and from the next generation’s perspective.

1 God values the next generation.

One generation shall commend your works to another, and shall declare your mighty acts. **PSALM 145:4**

Since the beginning, God has worked generationally and He values the next generation. The Bible says that one generation should commend God’s works to the next. This is God’s design. How did God reveal Himself to Isaac (Genesis 26:24)? If we train the next generation in the way they should go, what will happen (Proverbs 22:6)?

2 The preceding generation is to challenge and believe in the next generation.

3 The next generation is to set a godly example.

. . . set the believers an example in speech, in conduct, in love, in faith, in purity. **1 TIMOTHY 4:12**
