¹⁴But as for you, continue in what you have learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it ¹⁵and how from childhood you have been acquainted with the sacred writings, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus.

2 TIMOTHY 3:14,15

(Read also **LUKE 24:27,44,45.**)

The word “canon” means “rule” or “measuring rod.” It is a standard everything else is measured by. Paul reminded and encouraged Timothy to continue in what he had *learned and have firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it*. These, the teachings of Scripture, were carefully thought about in light of what they said and who taught them. They needed to be held up to a standard of the Law and the Prophets (our Old Testament), and the teachings of Jesus and His apostles, so the Christians could see if they were true or not (Luke 24:27,44). In the same way, the way by which we live our lives should be held up to the standard of the Word. It is only by reading and meditating on Scripture that we are equipped to live a righteous life. Here, we will see why and how Scripture is canon for us.

1 Scripture is the Word of God.

All Scripture is breathed out by God . . . **2 TIMOTHY 3:16**

Paul encouraged Timothy to remember the *sacred writings* he had been taught as a child, and not to be like the *evil people and impostors deceiving and being deceived* (2 Timothy 3:13). The standard Paul gave Timothy was the Scripture, *breathed out by God*. Because Scripture is the Word of God, it is the standard of living for all who follow Him. What does 2 Timothy 3:15 say about what the Word of God makes us?

2 Scripture has been established by God.

And beginning with Moses and all the Prophets, he interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning himself.

LUKE 24:27

The books of the Bible we have today were not randomly picked and placed in a book. Jesus used *Moses and all the Prophets* to explain to His disciples how the law, history, and all the prophecies pointed to His great story of salvation. This is now known as the Old Testament. The rest of Scripture, the New Testament, was established—identified and set—through Jesus’ life and teachings, and the teachings of His apostles. What does Psalm 119:89 say about God’s Word?

3 Scripture is the standard of truth and righteousness.

¹⁶*All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness,* ¹⁷*that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work.* **2 TIMOTHY 3:16,17**

(Read also **PSALM 119:160.**)

All Scripture was breathed out by God and established by Him. Paul describes Scripture as *profitable for teaching, reproof, correction, and for training in righteousness*. It is the standard we follow for a life of righteousness. As we read, meditate on, and obey the Word of God, we become *equipped for every good work* (2 Timothy 3:17). Why does Paul call Scripture *profitable*? Why should we apply it in our own lives?
