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Spiritual Disciplines

WARM-UP

WORD

“Beware of practicing your righteousness before other people in order to be seen by them, for then you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven.”

MATTHEW 6:1

(Read also **MATTHEW 6:2-8,16-18.**)

Spiritual disciplines are an important part of a Christian’s life. Like exercise, they build up our spiritual muscles for a deeper and richer relationship with God. In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus warned His disciples to be careful of practicing these disciplines with the motive of being seen by others. Here we will look at three spiritual disciplines Jesus encouraged His disciples to practice: generosity, prayer, and fasting.



1 Give to the needy.

³“But when you give to the needy, do not let your left hand know what your right hand is doing, ⁴so that your giving may be in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.”

MATTHEW 6:3,4

When we give to those in need, our motive should not be to call attention to ourselves. If so, the attention itself will become our reward. Instead, we should give *in secret*, with the intent to bless even if others won't know what we've done. Jesus promises that our Father will definitely see what we do and reward us. According to Acts 20:35, what is better: giving or receiving? Why?

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2 Pray to the Father.

⁶“But when you pray, go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you. ⁷And when you pray, do not heap up empty phrases as the Gentiles do, for they think that they will be heard for their many words. ⁸Do not be like them, for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.” **MATTHEW 6:6-8**

When we pray, our motive should not be to show others what we are doing or to draw attention to ourselves. Instead, if we pray in secret, Jesus assures us that our Father sees us and will reward us. In fact, He knows what we need even before we ask Him. Why do you think some pray for show? Why do you think Jesus emphasized praying in secret?

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3 Fast in secret.

¹⁶“And when you fast, do not look gloomy like the hypocrites, for they disfigure their faces that their fasting may be seen by others. Truly, I say to you, they have received their reward. ¹⁷But when you fast, anoint your head and wash your face, ¹⁸that your fasting may not be seen by others but by your Father who is in secret. And your Father who sees in secret will reward you.”

MATTHEW 6:16-18

We fast to become spiritually closer to God. If we fast only to be seen and acknowledged by others, we won't get a reward from our Father. We fast to know and seek God more. This means that we don't draw attention to ourselves while fasting, with gloomy expressions. And God, who sees us, will certainly reward us. According to Isaiah 58:8, what will happen when we fast?
