PRAYER

- Thank God that He allowed the gospel to take root in you. Thank Him for the one who preached the gospel to you and for the relationship that you now have with Him.
- Ask God for open doors to plant seeds of the gospel into the hearts of your friends and family. Thank Him for preparing their hearts to receive it.
- Pray for the words to say as you preach the message of the kingdom to others. Pray for faith to continue planting, believing that the seeds of the gospel are growing even when you don't see them.

WORD

31He put another parable before them, saying, "The kingdom of heaven is like a grain of mustard seed that a man took and sowed in his field. 32It is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is larger than all the garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches." 33He told them another parable. "The kingdom of heaven is like leaven that a woman took and hid in three measures of flour, till it was all leavened." MATTHEW 13:31-33

The kingdom of heaven is the dominion of God, which is something that we, as His children, look forward to, but is also happening here and now. As a part of this kingdom, the Church, His people, has a mission to preach the gospel, which is the message of the kingdom. During His time on earth, Jesus told the parables of the mustard seed and the leaven, from which we can learn some things about the gospel we preach.

1 The gospel seems insignificant.

"It is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is larger than all the garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches." MATTHEW 13:32

Like the tiny mustard seed, smallest of the seeds known and used by those in Israel, the message of the kingdom seems insignificant at first. Sometimes preaching the gospel does not have immediate results. Many great missionaries and evangelists preached for years before they saw any fruit. How can you hold on to faith even when your efforts seem useless? How can you remind yourself that it is God who brings the growth?

2 The gospel works unseen.

He told them another parable. "The kingdom of heaven is like leaven that a woman took and hid in three measures of flour, till it was all leavened" MATTHEW 13:33

The mustard seed grows steadily into a large tree and the leaven works all through the dough. Though it isn't obvious, every seed of the kingdom of heaven makes an impact. Through the power of the Spirit, the gospel works in and through the lives of people although no one can see it. As people receive the gospel, the kingdom grows. How can you move forward in faith even when you don't see the immediate outcome?

3 The gospel's impact is enormous.

³²"It is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is larger than all the garden plants and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches." ³³He told them another parable. "The kingdom of heaven is like leaven that a woman took and hid in three measures of flour, till it was all leavened." MATTHEW 13:32,33

In the end, the mustard seed grows into the largest of trees; the leaven that seems so little spreads amazingly far. In the same way, the gospel has an enormous impact, as it holds the most important message in the world. The gospel goes wide and deep; like the mustard seed and yeast, it influences and transforms although unseen. What does 1 Corinthians 3:6 say about the growth of believers?
